Santouria of Agiasos

The Santouria Department of the Agiasos Reading Society directed by folk musician Kostas Zafeiriou was founded in 2003. He began teaching santouri — a difficult to learn but so melodious instrument, both charming and impressive — to small children with admirable patience, orderliness and love for his students. Children schooled in tradition at this department might be growing and changing but they have made the "Santouria of Agiasos" famous all over the world, appearing in Greece and abroad, in various occasions: cultural events of their own or hosted by sister associations, charities, VIP welcome events, in universities, museums, festivals, etc. They have already recorded two cds.

The Santouria Department's great repertoire includes traditional rhythms and songs from Lesvos and Asia Minor: syrto, hasapiko, hasaposerviko, karsilama, zeibekiko, serenades and handpicked rebetiko and folk songs.

Two "Kariotakises" appear on stage; the lyrical poet (lyric singer) and the everyday human in a doomed reality (actor). Kariotakis' poetry and writings appear in one frame across his thoughts who generate the inner collision on another frame, however not secondary but connected and identical to the first one.

In the framework of collaborations with art ensembles from abroad, our festival hosts violinist Mehmet Yasemin and musician Derva Turkan on Klasik Kemence (a traditional musical instrument). The first part is a concert by two acclaimed violinists: Apollonas Grammatikopoulos, concertino of Athens State Orchestra, Greece and Mehmet Yasemin from Turkey. For the second part, the acclaimed "Athens Quartet" collaborates with Derya Turkan in a combination of classical and traditional music from both countries. The "Athens Quartet" will also present a series of works by Greek composers especially orchestrated for this ensemble.

This concert will host vocal and organic compositions from the urban environment of Istanbul — both formal and popular — along with beloved songs and dance numbers from Lesvos. All vocals will be performed by acclaimed singer **Dilek Türkan**, known for her extensive work in performance and discography, accompanied by **Derya Türkan** on Klasik Kemençe. The two of them will be joined on stage with **Nikos Andrikos**, a musician from Mytilene and assistant professor at the Department of Music Studies, University Of Ioannina, with longtime studies and art-related activity in Istanbul. The repertoire will be performed by the well-known orchestra type in Istanbul's urban environment, consisting of Lavta and Klasik Kemençe, while vocals will play the predominant role in the songs and other vocal improvisations (Gazel).

During the first part, a concert from student ensembles participating in masterlass seminars will take place.
